Keith,

Normally colored orbs (especially purple, blue) are caused by "Lens Flare". What happens is that an excess of light from some source often out of the scene makes it into the camera lens. Because of the angle that it is coming from it ends up reflecting inside the complex lens structure, often creating a bright dot. You often see this in videos as the camera moves past the sun, you'll see a row of circles or dots form.

Generally in photography you'll see this when a flash is used. Flashes create such brilliant instantaneous light that it can create a variety of strange effects.

Not sure if you're familiar with something in physics called the coefficient of linear refraction, also known as the refractive index. All materials have one, and it relates to the change in velocity of light within any given medium. This index effects something called the Brewsters angle which is the angle at which light is reflected rather than refracted. In other words for a given material, at some angle light stops going through it and starts bouncing back at the angle it hit the change in surfaces. This is important because that is the basic effect that creates lens flares. Bright light at an angle greater than the Brewsters angle for the "Glass" or other material the lens is made of, starts getting reflected back against the various surfaces of the lens. This is why often you never see the bright object that's causing the reflections.

That's a good question Keith. I just had a guy send me a photo of orbs that were orange in front of a redwood tree in California. He said they were energy orbs. I myself cannot say for sure. He could be right. Honestly, I don't think anyone on this forum can tell you the meanings of the color of orbs. I've had rare occasions where I photographed orbs outside and in one room; both had multiple orbs but I can't say for sure if there was anything to them. If you have enough light in a room, put your camera on a tripod and use the timer on it to take a photo without you touching it. The most important thing to understand about orbs is that they are not technically dust. Instead they are a digital "mistake" or artifact of how a digital camera deals with dust, moisture, pollen, etc when it reflects a flash too close to a camera for it to be in focus. Outdoor shots always seem to have more orbs than inside. That is not because there is more dust in the air so much as that the "depth of field" is usually much farther. In other words the camera's focal point is further away making anything close out of focus.

When dealing with orbs I always suggest taking a quick look at

Once a person has read that, then I can ask them what makes their orb different from the examples and explanations posted there. Then they have the choice of ignoring science all together or actually reasoning.

Steven, you will know what I mean with this statement. "I don't talk to many people about any of this because it makes most people very uncomfortable to be around people who are sensitive to their unknowns." So my terminology may not be up to par with others here on all this, sorry.

"Keith, since spirits come to you, why do you need a reading?"

Spirits aren't in every room at all times. For me to "read them" (In my mind "Know they are there" but not necessarily there to communicate with me) I simply meant I know of the presence. They choose as whether to communicate or not and if they choose not to communicate at that time they are just a presence in my mind's eye.

Terminology hurdles?

As for "coming to me," I simply meant spirits seem to know who is sensitive to them not that they must or will communicate. Sorry if I miss lead anyone with the statement of "drawn in like a beacon" It was to me a simple explanation to say they know who believes and who does not and they may or may not look for those people to communicate with.

You are right Steven, and it has as far as knowing where to focus our time on site.

I believe that spirits can get comfortable with who they see often and decide to communicate with. As with the little boy in a wool coat who visits our guests now and then here where I live. Although they may sense someone who knows they are there I believe they still, just as we are, able to decide whether to trust or not. I (we) am/are a stranger(s) to these spirits as well as anyone who walks into their location for the first time.

Trust is earned and a single visit may not be enough to earn that trust. Remember we intrude on their turf and we are trying our hardest to get proof of something they may not want everyone to know. Their very existence. They know, I believe.

When I do get a spirit in my photo I would love to show it... Ummmmm. Maybe that is why so few Spirit photos exist, they may not want them shown to all?

Being at this "Spirit hunting" thing for a short time and yet learning I yet have a lot to learn as to capturing Spirit's images. As I often know of their locations on site, which helps, and when we encounter them, yet a photograph rarely shows little to nothing of proof positive. Perhaps I'm doing something wrong in picture taking but at this point in my thoughts I am to the belief that Spirits seem to have control of that aspect and can either avoid the pictures or just are not being picked up.

I have yet to see a photo that shows a full spirit as those I see. What I mostly see is the person as they were when alive. Their image of the most liked time in life perhaps. To me they are never in color, always in monotonous, I believe they choose whether to be a presence or a spirit as I see them in my opinion.

So I yet wait for the day I finally take a picture of what I see. Pictures with mists, orbs, shadows and distortions may well be spirits in one stage or another I can't say for sure. But this is what we most often see labeled "Spirits."
